



The high standards in teaching and learning are ensured by the correction measures based upon the feedback received from various stake holders

The College follows both Conventional and discrete mode of teaching and learning with special impetus on ICT learning, Film and video presentations, online and offline educational broadcasts programmes, practical work, directed study of texts, study of open learning materials, Group learning and discussions, seminars, group tutorials, remedial and tutorials for weaker students..

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

All components in any programme of study are evaluated continuously through internal evaluation and an external evaluation.

Internal evaluation is done throughout year in the form of mid examinations and assignments. External evaluation is done at the end of year in the form of end examination.

Examiners for External Practical are always selected from outside the college.

Irrespective of very less freedom for reforms in the examination system at the college level, the college maintains a high academic standard in conducting Unit tests, internal and external practical exams

6.3.4 Research and Development

Research and Development cell is an integral part of the activities of our college. The College has well developed research committee that monitors and facilitates the research activity .This cell is one of the wings of the Institute which facilitates, channelizes, records, and regulates all the academic, sponsored, collaborative research projects and consultancy works in the Institute.

The objective of the Research Cell varies from the advancement of theoretical knowledge to development of new technology to solve practical problems. The research conducted till now has covered areas such as theoretical and applied aspects of core science (Physics, Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Electronics and mathematics),

During this academic year 09 research papers were published in National and International Journals. 11 papers were presented in National Seminars and Conferences. One Major project and two Minor research projects ongoing in the Department of Management Studies and Chemistry.

A few of the ongoing projects are: "Biodiversity of Aquatic angiosperms in Kashmir Himalayan lakes and the impact of Anthropogenic activities on their distribution sponsored by Ministry of Environment and Forest, Govt. Of India, New Delhi" under Dr. Abdul Majeed Kak, Retired. Professor, Department of Botany, ICSC, Srinagar.

One UGC Sponsored Major Research Project titled "Quality of work life in Higher Education: A case study of Selected Colleges of Jammu and Kashmir" sanctioned to Dr Mehrajudin Shad of the Department of Management Studies to the tune of 5.80 Lac.

Two Minor Research projects titled "Synthesis Characterization Magnetic and Conductive study of some Axially binucleate Macrocyclic Ligand Complexes" and Design and the Synthesis of some novel metal complexes as Drugs and potential therapeutic Agents sanctioned to Dr Mir Bilal Parvaiz and Dr Aijaz Ahmad Tak, Department of Chemistry to the tune of 1.60 lac and 2.00 lac.

Ten teachers have participated in Orientation Programmes and Refresher Courses.

One more teachers have applied for the guideship to the University of Kashmir and the number of research guides has risen to four

The research projects have also acted as the training ground for the young postgraduates of our college Notifications have been issued to the teachers and students about the research funding of various funding agencies.

A Teaching and non- teaching staff tour is sponsored by the Management every year.


