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6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The Institution focuses on multi skill development of students in order to ensure employability. Curriculum under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) enables the Placement Cell to conduct programmes throughout the year so as to help students acquire the necessary soft skills for employment.

The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) followed at present in the College facilitates horizontal movement, enabling students to make their choices.

All the Skill Based Elective courses are available to students irrespective of their major subjects. This facility enables students to choose the courses of their interest and for future development.

Teaching Staff of all the departments as board of studies members contribute to up gradation, review and change of syllabus encouraging staff to attend syllabus revision workshops.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The College provides best possible Class rooms, Laboratories, Computer labs and other related teaching facilities including the highly dedicated, trained and qualified faculty. The high standards in teaching and learning are ensured by the correction measures based upon the feedback received from various stake holders

The College follows both Conventional and discrete mode of teaching and learning with special impetus on ICT learning, Film and video presentations, online and offline educational broadcasts programmes, practical work, directed study of texts, study of open learning materials, Group learning and discussions, seminars, group tutorials, remedial and tutorials for weaker students

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

All components in any programme of study are evaluated continuously through internal evaluation and an external evaluation.

Internal evaluation is done throughout semester in the form of internal/ external practical examinations/Project work/presentation/assignments. External evaluation is done at the end of semester in the form of end examination.

Question paper setters for end examination are from outside the college.

Examination cell of the College prepare the scheme of evaluation, giving guidelines for the examiners for distribution of marks for different points in the question. Evaluation of answer scripts is be done by the external examiners from other colleges and universities.

Students are permitted to request for recounting/ revaluation of the end theory examination answer scripts within a stipulated period after announcement of the results.

After recounting or revaluation, records are updated with changes if any and the students are issued a revised memorandum of marks. If there are no changes, the students are intimated the same through a letter or a notice.

Based on the credits and marks obtained by the student Credit Point Average (CPA) will be calculate for semester/year and Cumulative Credit Point Average (CCPA) will be calculated for entire program. Awards of class will be finalized based on CCPA.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Research is a significant activity of the college. During this academic year various research papers were published in National and International Journals. 08 papers were presented in National Seminars and Conferences. 1 major project completed and 3 minor research projects submitted to various funding agencies. 10 teachers have participated in Orientation Programmes and Refresher. one Major and two minor projects already going on. One faculty selected for Raman post doctoral fellowship by UGC to pursue research in USA.

One more teachers have applied for the guideship to the University of Kashmir and the number of research guides has risen to 5

Research and Development cell is an integral part of the activities of our college. The College has well developed research committee that monitors and facilitates the research activity .This cell is one of the wings of the Institute which facilitates, channelizes, records, and regulates all the academic, sponsored, collaborative research projects and consultancy works in the Institute.

The objective of the Research Cell varies from the advancement of theoretical knowledge to development of new technology to solve practical problems. The research conducted till now has covered areas such as theoretical and applied aspects of core science (Physics, Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Electronics and Mathematics),. The research projects have also acted as the training ground for the young postgraduates of our college Notifications have been issued to the teachers and students about the research funding of various funding agencies.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS): The College has introduced Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in the Curriculum from the academic Session 2015-2016 in view of being granted autonomous Status by University Grants Commission, New Delhi with concurrence from the Government of Jammu and Kashmir and affiliating University. The CBCS provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses (core, elective or minor or soft skill courses).

Credit Based Semester System (CBSS): Under the CBSS, the requirement for awarding a degree or diploma or certificate is prescribed in terms of number of credits to be completed by the students.

The College Admission Committee (CAD) supervises the entire admission process the Committees scrutinizes, verifies and counsels the candidates. After drawing up the merit list of the selected candidates, the committee verifies to ensure accuracy of data. Counseling was provided to the candidates regarding the demands of the Course as well as the choice. Final endorsement of the admissions was done by the Principal.

Admission to various Degree Courses was made strictly in accordance to the procedure laid down University of Kashmir, UGC and state Government..

The intake capacity and cutoff point for different Courses was guided by the directions issued by the State Higher Education Department.

The Admission was open for all the sections of society.

The Admission to various Courses commences and ended as per the existing time schedule

The College under the directions of Chief minister of The state have Adopted two School viz Government Girls Higher secondary School , Nowhatta and Boys Higher secondary School, Zadabal.

Final year science students are given the project work of three months (under career advancement program). Here various departments of natural science faculty work in collaboration for the completion of the projects as the nature of the projects is generally interdisciplinary.

Department of Mathematics provides its faculty to departments of Chemistry and Botany to teach the mathematical portion of their syllabus.

The Department of Mathematics organises a bridge course for those students of BBA and BCA who are weak in mathematics or with a non-mathematical background.

The department of computer applications organises various computer related programmes for B Sc. And B Com. Students that comes under the purview of their curriculum.
